TEXAS MASONIC HEROES

LORENZO de ZAVALA

First Vice-President of the Republic

Of the all the men who signed the Texas Declaration of Independence, none equaled Lorenzo de Zavala in education, political experience, or diplomatic service.

Born in 1788, in a small village in the Yucatan, Manuel Lorenzo Justiniano de Zavala y Saenz graduated from the seminary at Merida in 1807. He founded several newspapers, but his political views led to his imprisonment in Veracruz in 1814. Fluent in Spanish, French, English, and Latin, he studied medical textbooks while in prison, and was ready to practice medicine upon his release in 1817. In 1820 he was elected to public office, and in 1821 was appointed Deputy to the Spanish Cortes in Madrid.

A leader of the Federalist Party, he served in the Mexican Senate and Congress, and took an active part in establishing York Rite Masonry in Mexico as an alternative to the older Scottish Rite (Escocese) Grand Orient style of Masonry. In 1826 the Grand Lodge of New York issued charters to five lodges in Mexico City. These five Yorkino lodges formed the nucleus of the movement that favored the decentralization of

At the battle of Fredericksburg, Captain T. B. Wearengen, General Mead's Adjutant General, was wounded through the lungs, he was badly bruised, and was found senseless on the field by a North Carolina Confederate Officer. The officer, believing him to be a mason because of a jewel found on his person, had him carried to a house used as headquarters. The officer called a surgeon to dress his wound, which was thought fatal; yet by the kind care and watching of the craft he was soon able to proceed to Richmond.

His blankets were returned by the half-naked and blanket-less Confederate soldiers, and nothing else was taken from him.

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government power. Zavala became the Charter Master of Independencia Lodge No. 454, but his political enemies forced him to leave Mexico in 1830.

During the next few years, he visited Europe and the United States, and dined in the White House with President Jackson. On his return to Mexico in 1833 he was appointed Minister to France, but resigned his post in protest of Santa Anna's defection to the Centralist He returned to Texas to Party. regain some of his fortune and retire from politics. Elected Vice-President of the new provisional government, he fled with the other officers to Galveston. After the Battle of San Jacinto many of the wounded were treated in his home nearby. Lorenzo de Zavala died of pneumonia at his home on Buffalo Bayou on November 15, 1836.

FREEMASONRY IS NOT A CULT BECAUSE.

(Continued from last Month) Many self styled religious experts are convinced that because Masons have a Bible in the Lodge and open and close meetings with a prayer it is a religious cult. If so, it must be about the sorriest cult in existence because,

12. Rational behavior is valued in Freemasonry. Cults stultify members' critical thinking abilities and capacity for rational, independent thinking; normal thought processes are stifled and broken (somewhat like the manner of actions of those who make the charge that Freemasons are cultists!).

13. Suggestions and criticism can be made to leadership through advocated, proper channels. There are no 'suggestion boxes' in cults. the cult is always right, and the members (and outsiders) are always wrong.

14. Masonic leadership is elected, usually annually. no Masonic leader serves 'for life'. Should a Masonic leader act improperly, he can be removed from office. Even the highest ranking officer within a Masonic jurisdiction (a Grand Master) serves at the will and pleasure of the membership and can be removed for malfeasance or acts detrimental to the fraternity.

15. There is no single leader of Freemasonry. there are hundreds of grand lodges throughout the world, and each is sovereign unto itself. A grand lodge controls only its own subordinate lodges and no others. Rules made by a grand lodge apply only to its own members.

16. Masons may affiliate with more than one grand lodge. With rare exceptions, there is no bar to joining multiple lodges in multiple jurisdictions.

17. Freemasonry does not use its

members for medical and psychological experiments - period! cults essentially perform psychological experiments on their m e m b e r s t h r o u g h implementing thought-reform processes without members' knowledge or consent.

18. Masons become more and more a part of the community through various lodge-sponsored events. In a cult, members come to know less and less abut the outside world; contact with or information about life outside the cult is sometimes openly frowned upon, if not forbidden.

19. Freemasonry has no particular dietary suggestions or recommendations. typically, because of intense work schedule, lack of funds, and other cult demands, members are not able to maintain healthy eating habits. (Freemasons frequently host public dinners which anyone can attend and Masonic events regularly have plenty of food for those attending.)

20. Masonry regularly contributes to other groups and organizations. Masonic organizations take leadership positions in fund raising for charities and public good.

For these and many other reasons, Freemasonry is not a cult - and, in fact, is further from it than the practices of many of those who hurl the term at it as if it were an evil invective.

The next time you hear or read of someone calling a Mason a cultist, we hope you will look closely at their own background and beliefs. Perhaps they know about cults because of themselves....

HAMBURGER PIE

1 lb hamburger	1 large onion
1 can cream corn	cornbread mix
1 lb grated cheese	1 egg
milk as needed	Jalapeno ???

Nellie usually uses a cast iron skillet, but that's a personal choice. Add 1/2 of the cream corn and the egg to the dry cornbread mix. Add enough milk to make it a batter Put half of the batter in the pan. Cover batter with the browned hamburger meat. Sprinkle the chopped onion, grated cheese and remender of cream corn over the meat. Add chopped jalapeno pepper if desired. Cover with remaining batter and bake until done.
