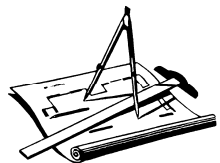

~Did You Know?~ The Color Blue

Blue is the symbol of truth and universality, and we have seen how it was therefore much used by Divine command, and in the vestments of the Jewish priests. It is the color appropriate to the First Three Degrees, or Ancient Craft Masonry, and the curtains, cushions, etc. of a Lodge are therefore blue. This color naturally suggests the thoughts of the blue sky and the blue sea; of their vast extent, their profound depths, those of the sky being absolutely without limit; of their changelessness throughout the lapse of ages, though clouds may sometimes for a while obscure the sky, and the storms agitate the surface of the sea. There is much to engage the mind and much to affect the heart in the thought of the perfect stillness of the ocean depths, to which the power of the most fearful storms never reaches; and of the ever unbroken repose of the illimitable space beyond the clouds, where the orbs of heaven always shine in pure and serene majesty. Such thoughts carry away the mind from the world and its vicissitudes and cares to the better country. Nor is this all. The color that symbolizes truth and universality teaches us to maintain truth in our relations to God Himself and to our fellow man, and it teaches us that our charity ought to be extended to the entire human race. Truth in our relation to God is, in other words, sincerity and earnestness in religion, implying a continual cultivation of its graces, and a constant endeavor to discharge all its duties. Truth, in relation to our fellow-men, implies not only the avoidance of all falsehood in speech, but of all that savors of deceit in our conduct, uprightness in all our dealings, a perfect and unimpeachable honesty, such that our own conscience may have nothing of which to accuse us, even in transactions the true character of which only God and ourselves can discern.

Many of you won't remember Jack LaLanne. Some of you will only remember him as the guy from the juicer commercial. Some of us older guys will recall Jack LaLanne as the guy with the first exercise program on television.

Every week day morning (when you were sick at home from school) Jack would come on air with his sturdy chair and pure white German Shepard(s). Jack would then coax our Moms into doing some exercises. Jack LaLanne was the first guru of exercise and nutrition on television, and an inspiration of generations of body builders. Space here limits my ability to relate all his exploits.

I am sad to report that Jack LaLanne passed away on January 23, 2011 from complications of pneumonia (exercising every day until his passing).

What we didn't know was that Jack LaLanne - or better Brother Jack LaLanne was a Freemason. Brother LaLanne was Raised to the Sublime Degree of Master Mason on March 17, 1949 in Chateau Thierry Lodge # 569 (which merged to become the current Crow Canyon Lodge #551 in Castro Valley, California). Brother Jack LaLanne was a member in good standing until his untimely passing.

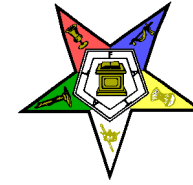
I will miss Brother LaLanne. He was an inspiration to us all. He will be missed.
