Dear Brethren:

One of the many functions of a Worshipful Master is to spread Masonic Light throughout the craft. The candidates for Free Masonry are given additional light in each of the advancing degrees until the sublime degree of Master Mason is conferred upon them.

How unique and rewarding it becomes to observe an individual become a Master Mason. This to the individual become a graduation certificate or a certificate of eligibility to work among the craft. The individual begins to work and takes an active part in lodge affairs and functions and is often seen not only in his own lodge, but other lodges in the district. During this time the light of Masonry is flourishing and becomes a beacon for the brethren.

Then, without warning the light diminishes entirely and the same individual who a short time ago was exalted and elated in being a mason is now but a dues paying member only. In many instances attendance is beyond the length of the cable tow, in many it is not. How rewarding it would be to see this light rekindled into the once shinning beacon.

The individual is never rewarded or given special recognition for his attendance, but by the same token, he is never penalized or admonished. His counterpart in other civic organizations may have his name prominently displayed in the news media constantly. However, in Masonry, this does not occur.

The cover of the trestleboard this month depicts King Solomon and the entire craft building King Solomon's Temple. Everyone is taking an active part and in modern language, is doing his thing. It is hoped that the 1973 Masonic Year and the ensuing years will spread light and the light will shine bright rather than fade and die.
