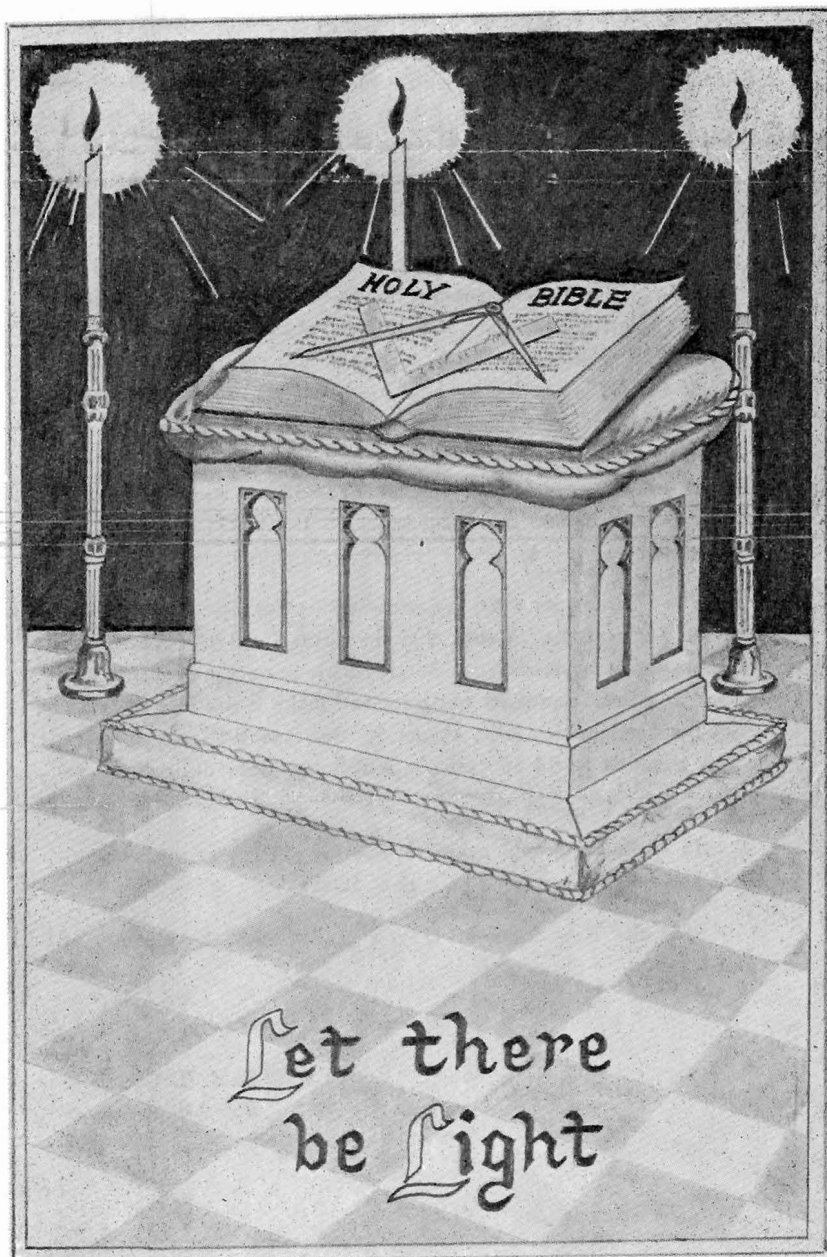


# SHEKINAH LODGE No. 58
