
SHEKINAH LODGE No. 58

Free and Accepted Masons

Millville, New Jersey Instituted - May 21, 1861



Brethren:

At our Regular Communication in March, a Ways and Means Committee was appointed to find ways to implement the recommendations of the Fact Finding Committee. The Ways and Means Committee concluded that, in order to better handle Building Funds, a Templar Association should be formed; and have presented a motion on the floor which will be voted upon at our May 7th meeting. The motion is that we adopt the following resolution:—

"Be It Resolved That, a Temple Association, to be known as "Shekinah Lodge No. 58, Masonic Temple Association," be formed for the purpose to promote among its members activities of a civic, social and cultural nature; to promote good will and feeling among its members and to help them to become better acquainted; to assist one another in their respective endeavors whenever necessary; for the moral and mental improvement of men and others; for charitable purposes; to enjoy and have all the rights and privileges conferred by the State of New Jersey on associations formed under the act of the Legislature including the power to hold, operate, and control, improve, enlarge, and maintain real and personal property so far as said rights, powers, and priveleges shall be consistent with, and shall be necessary and desirable for the purposes of the Association."

Progressive ideas are being considered and it is hoped that anyone with a question should be present to ask. When was the last time you showed a keen interest in the affairs of your lodge?

Brethren, you may or may not know that under the present interpretation of the property tax laws, properties of fraternal organizations are subject to property tax, just as in the case of your own real estate. This interpretation is causing extreme hardship in the case of many Masonic Lodges in order to pay taxes; even to the extent of some lodges being forced to give up their lodge buildings. It also has prevented some from building new lodges where they might be needed because of inability to pay the tax on the new properties.

However, a bill has been introduced in the State Assembly concerning the exemption from taxation of certain property of fraternal organizations. It was brought up for vote; but was returned to committee where it could very well die unless pressure is brought to bear on our elected representatives to get this bill out of committee and back to the Legislature. This bill is call Assembly Bill No. A - 1340. It is the urgent request of the Grand Master, and of Shekinah Lodge in particular that our membership flood the mail of our State Legislators and urge them to do all in their power to release this bill from committee and vote favorably to exempt those properties from taxation. In this area, the people to write to are Assemblymen James R. Hurley and James S. Cafiero, and State Senator Robert E. Kay.
