February marks the birthday of George Washington, our First President and also a fellow mason. The following is some information concerning one of our more famous brethren.

George Washington was made a mason in Fredericksberg Lodge, Fredericksberg, Virginia, on November 4, 1752. Because of his great interest in the fraternity, he was selected to be the first Worshipful Master of a new lodge, Alexandria Lodge No. 22, Alexandria, Virginia, when it was warranted on April 28, 1788. He served the rest of that year and was elected Worshipful Master for the year 1789.

On April 30, 1789, while serving as Worshipful Master, Washington was inaugurated President of the United States in New York City, then the National Capital. Robert R. Livingston, Chancellor of New York State, administered the oath of office on the Masonic Bible taken from the alter of Saint Johns Lodge No. 1 of New York City.

George Washington's attachment to the Masonic Fraternity throughout his forty seven years as a member shows itself through his correspondence and association with various lodges and numerous individual members. On many occasions Washington's references of the fraternity shows such high regard for it that there is no doubt that freemasonry was indeed a guide in his life.

Upon his death at Mount Vernon on December 14, 1799, Alexandria Lodge No. 22 had charge of the funeral arraignments and by them he was laid to eternal rest with full Masonic Honors.
