In presenting the pin and card, I explain the significance of the pin and mention that it is recognized by all masons for its meaning. I also assure the family of a 24 hour "Helpline" (1-800-792-8690) available to provide a wide range of assistance and to refer any need of the family to the presiding master for resolution.

So while it may be a feeling of mixed emotions to the master, it is certainly one that he can approach with confidence, knowing that he has the backing and support of the many programs and members of this great masonic fraternity.
