This is a very big event for the patients and they really look forward to these nights with enthusiasm. The bowling would be held on weekdays between the hours of 6 to 9 PM. Would it not be great to get enough volunteers to run this event once or twice a month, or maybe more!

Although this is a Masonic sponsored undertaking, we would welcome help from anyone, male or female, member or non-member. I hope that you will join me in trying to make these "OLD SOLDIERS" which I might add, are both male and female, just a little happier. Let us not forget what we were taught: "The greatest of these is CHARITY; for faith is lost in sight, hope ends in fruition, but charity extends beyond the grave, thru the boundless realms of eternity."
