What is morality, veiled, allegory and symbols? Webster defines them as such: Morality: "good and proper conduct, rules of right and wrong, ethics". That we are willing to give up some of our own time to help others less fortunate. Is this not what we are obligated as Masons to do? We as men and as Masons need to do more! Please come out and bring with you your ideas, and become part of our endeavors, and remember that you only get out of Masonry what you put into it!

On a lighter side we have made many improvements to the lodge building over the summer and are holding many fund raisers to help pay for them. One of which is the reselling of the chairs in the Lodge Room. If you are interested in purchasing one in your name or in honor of someone, please contact me, or one of the trustees. The names that are now on the chairs will stay there, we will just add another name to them.
