
# SHEKINAH LODGE, No. 58

#### Dear Brethren:

There are several members of Shekinah Lodge who fail to attend any of the Lodge functions or stated meetings. I know that these brethren receive a trestleboard from this Lodge through the efforts of our Secretary. I have further been informed that these brethren would attend meetings if they were able to remember some of their previous degree work; words, signs, etc.

I am sure that this situation or problem exists in all Lodges. When a problem is recognized it follows logically that a remedy or solution to that problem can be instituted. The only way a solution can be effected is to enforce its rules and principles. However, masonry cannot and should not be enforced or demanded on its brethren, but rather expected or anticipated. Management principles relate that 100% participation for any endeavor is virtually impossible. If achieved it becomes total participation and acceptance. However, 70% participation is considered to be good to excellent.

The Secretary mails 415 trestleboards per month to members of our Lodge. This is an expense in itself with the cost of envelopes, stamps, trestleboards, etc., not to mention the labor or time involved. 70% of that figure would be 290. I realize this is virtually asking for a miracle, however, I will endeavor to do just that and eliminate the cushion that has been aforementioned.

On May 24th at 7:30 P.M. the Lodge will be opened on an informal basis for those brethren who would desire a refresher in masonic signs, protocol, etc. I know that my officers would greatly appreciate a large turnout and will welcome all brethren with open arms. To those of you who were embarrassed, I say "comon down", have fun and enjoy the good fellowship and an informal rap session. Refreshments too.
