The Annual Meeting of the Pierre Masonic Building Board was held on January 28th, 2008 with 18 present constituting a quorum. The meeting was called to order at 7:00PM. The following association by-law amendments were amended and approved:

- Section 10 was amended to require the position Treasurer to be an elected member of the board of trustees;
- Section 18 was amended to delete wording that stated that the President would be the custodian of all bonds given to the Association;
- Section 21 was amended to change the Association membership to 13 in order to add 3 members from Ft. Pierre Lodge No. 123, and 1 member from the Oahe Shrine Club;
- Section 23 was amended to require the election of the Treasurer as provided in Section 10, provide a financial report at each regular meeting of the board, and to require three signatures on all accounts (Treasurer, President and Vice-President).

The minutes of last year's annual meeting were read and approved as read. The Treasurer's Report was presented by Perry Anderson and approved. It was suggested that we communicate to all members the importance of contributing to the Endowment Fund. This fund will pay a yearly dividend regardless of the interest rate and helps the board to plan for necessary repairs and improvements on the building throughout the year. Anyone desiring more information should contact Perry Anderson.

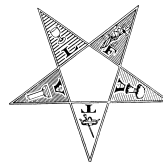
WB Charles Walker presented a list of items related to improvements of the building. These items were discussed and will be taken into consideration.

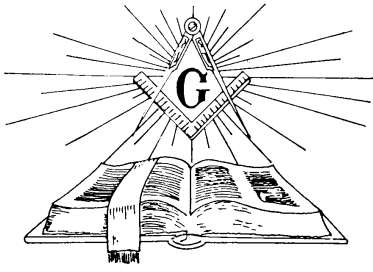

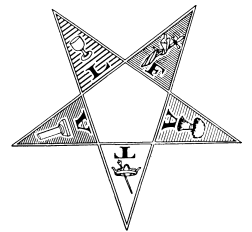
